Health Article - Menopause

As women grow older, their ovarian follicles diminish in number. Menopause is the time that marks the end of your menstrual cycles. The median age of menopause is 51. Menopause is a natural biological process. During menopause there is also a cessation in ovulation (production of eggs by the ovaries) which translates to them not being able to bear children during this phase of their life. There are certain symptoms to watch out for and they include;

- 1. Irregular Periods
- 2. Vaginal Dryness
- Mood and Memory Effects; these might include anxiety, less interest in sexual activity etc.
- 4. Insomnia
- 5. Loss of breast fullness

Menopause can be as a result from:

Age:

As women age ovaries start making less hormones that regulate menstruation and from there onwards fertility also declines. Women in their 40's may experience lighter, shorter, heavier and more less frequent menstruation.

On the average by 51 the ovaries completely stop releasing eggs and no more periods.



Chemotherapy:

Women undergoing cancer treatments would most times go through a menopausal phase because of the cancer treatments cause a halt to menstruation, ovulation and fertility. Although this halt to menstruation is not always permanent during chemotherapy.

Surgical Menopause:

Menopause can also be surgically induced by removal of ovaries.

WHEN TO SEE A DOCTOR

Keep up with regular visits with your doctor for preventive health care and any medical concerns. Continue getting these appointments during and after menopause.

Preventive health care as you age may include recommended health screening tests, such as colonoscopy, mammography and triglyceride screening. Your doctor might recommend other tests and exams, too, including thyroid testing if suggested by your history, and breast and pelvic exams.

Always seek medical advice if you have bleeding from your vagina after menopause.
